Aladdin

Jasmine
Jasmine is a Princess who wants to see the world outside the palace. She meets Aladdin in the market and falls in love.

Genie

Jafar



Q: Is this the first Broadway show you've attended as a family?


2011: 81% yes


Weekend matinees continue to be most popular choice for timing of performances

Q: Which performance time would work best for you and your family?


Season 1: 85% weekend matinee

Q: Did you utilize the quiet and/or activity areas?


2011: 80% yes

MORE FINDINGS

- On average, 70% of our audiences constantly look to our volunteers for help.
- More than half of our patrons use the pre-performance prep materials (i.e. parent guides, social narratives, character guides, etc.).
- 25% of our attendees this season found out about our shows from outside of our organization (i.e. family, friends, other organizations).
