Oversees planning, execution, support of mission-based programming

Builds relationships with cultural orgs & disability communities Support other administrative needs as necessary



Steering Committee Expectations

Qualifications for Applicants (not an "all or nothing" deal)

- Experience with program creation, admin skills, knowledge of accessible technology
- Professional or personal experience with disability and accessibility at cultural institutions
- Have a passion for making cultural spaces more accessible, are a great communicator, and are able to manage your time independently
- Cultural Access Collaborative values the experiences of people who have disabilities;
 individuals with disabilities are encouraged to apply

Access Calendar

Cultural Access Collab maintains a calendar of accessible events presented across Chicagoland, and now all of Illinois.

- 1. Organizations submit events and indicate which accessible services will be provided.
- 2. Events are reviewed by Access Calendar team (2-3 members)
- Events are put into the Collab's online Access Calendar. Also shared on our social media outlets by our Programming and Communications Coordinator
- 4. Statewide Approach--building more pathways to share programming



Equipment Loan

Cultural Access Collab offers free short-term equipment loans to Chicago-area cultural organizations.

We help support organizations that are interested in access, but may not have the funds to support buying accessible technology. You can borrow from us and prove to your colleagues that it is worth it!



Equipment Loan

The Collab maintains an inventory of equipment at the Peggy Notebaert Nature Museum, which then is used all over the Chicagoland area.

- 1. Organizations submit requests through EL process on our website
- 2. Requests are reviewed by Equipment Loan team and required paperwork distributed to organization (2-3 members)
- 3. Requests are then confirmed/coordinated

- Stationary Audio Description Kit
- Stationary Assistive Listening System
- Portable FM Assistive Listening/AD System
- DIY Captioning Equipment
- Statewide Approach-exploring the future of Equipment loans!





Professional Development

Cultural Access Collaborative has offered **65+** educational programs engaging more than **5,000** cultural administrators.

In the past three years, virtual programming has allowed us engage both audiences and speakers from outside of the Chicagoland area, which has been a catalyst for our expanded statewide vision



Professional Development

Types of trainings offered:

- Intro to accessibility
- Deeper dives into specific topics
- Book club style events where participants are encouraged to read or watch something before attending.
- Lunch and Learns casual conversations with peers on topics
- Socials opportunities to network with others in the field of access
- Annual Fundraiser





Professional Development

The desired audience for programs differs based on content (museum professionals, theatre professionals, gallery spaces, educational staff)

We aim for professional development to be engaging and not too intimidating for anyone! It's all about the incremental changes!

Community Engagement

Promotional Support-Sharing out professional development opportunities with known and new networks

Tapping new partnerships and contacts for in-person events, speakers for professional development programs

Attending networking and community events to spread the word about the Collab and to help build trust



Additional Support Areas

Interested steering committee members can help with seeking out funding or grant opportunities, creating smaller funding events

SC members also assist Co-Chair and Board Leadership with reconciliation of annual fund gifts, such as writing thank you notes, some light bookkeeping

Assisting Programming and Communications Coordinator with Social posts, sharing interesting content in cultural accessibility
